



Assistant Professor - Physical Chemistry

Applications are invited for a tenure track faculty position at the rank of Assistant Professor in the Department of Chemistry at St. Bonaventure University, beginning August 2016, pending funding approval.

A Ph.D. in Chemistry (or a closely related discipline) with specialization in physical chemistry is required, along with a commitment to excellence in undergraduate teaching, research, and University service. Teaching responsibilities will include physical chemistry and general chemistry, as well as a core curriculum science course. The load is twelve contact hours per semester. Preference will be given to candidates with demonstrated teaching success in a college or university setting. Appreciation and respect for the University's Mission as a Catholic University in the Franciscan tradition are expected.
