Course work is available for post-Master's Degree students seeking Advanced Certification/Permanent Certification as a school counselor in Pennsylvania and New York.

### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Admission to this degree program is based on a review of multiple sources of information listed below:

1. Completion of a Master's Degree, Specialty in School Counseling
2. Graduate GPA 3.0 or better
3. References
4. Official transcript showing masters degree (unless earned from SBU)

### INTERNSHIP REQUIREMENT

In this program, students are expected to complete one semester-long internship of 300 clock hours with a certified counselor in a K-12 setting. Students must be employed one year as a school counselor before receiving permission to begin the internship (CE 621). This experience should be discussed with the adviser early in the program so the appropriate arrangements can be made.
