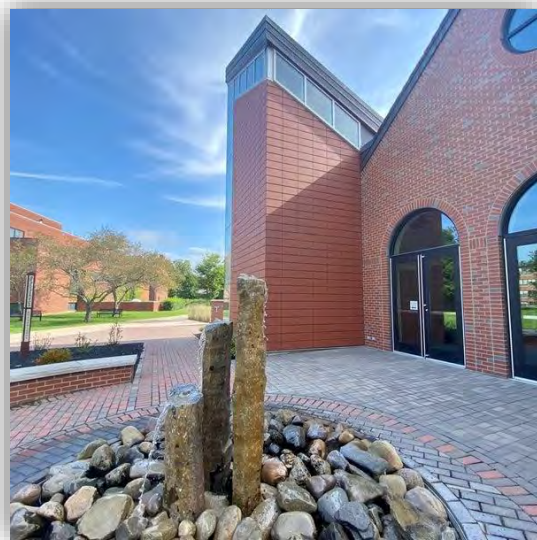

History of St. Bonaventure University

St. Bonaventure University was founded through the initiative and dedicated efforts of Nicholas Devereux, a large landholder and financier from Utica, N.Y., with the cooperation and support of John Timon, Bishop of Buffalo, and members of the Franciscan Order. Their dream of more than a century and a half ago has flourished, and St. Bonaventure University has expanded greatly during more than 160 years of its existence.

In 1854 the two promoters persuaded a group of friars from Italy to venture to America and establish a Catholic college and seminary in Western New York. Principal among these Franciscans was Fr. Pamphilus da Magliano, who later became the College's first President. On Oct. 4, 1858, the Feast of St. Francis, the formal dedication of the new school was held on the tract of land donated by Devereux. It was then that the College was named after St. Bonaventure of Bagnoregio, the Patron of Franciscan Studies and Learning. St. Bonaventure College held its first Commencement Exercise in June 1860, graduating a class of 15 students. Since then the University has grown to more than 2,000 students.

The College was provisionally chartered on March 1, 1875, by an Act of the Regents of the State of New York, "For the instruction ... in the learned languages and in the liberal and useful arts and science."

In the 1920s the College developed a full-time graduate program which has continually expanded since that time. Early in the 20th century St. Bonaventure also became home to the School of Franciscan Studies and the Franciscan Institute. The permanent Charter of Incorporation of the College was granted by the State in 1883, and in 1950, after nearly a century of operation, St. Bonaventure was named a University by the Board of Regents.



Seneca Nation Partnership

St. Bonaventure sits on the historic homeland of the Onödowa'ga:' (Seneca), just a few miles from the eastern edge of the Seneca Nation's Allegany Territory.

In the fall of 2023, the Seneca Nation Council approved joining a committee of university faculty, staff, students and administrators to deepen their shared connections and address the needs of the Nation, while also improving the education and richness of the experience for all members of the St. Bonaventure community.



In February 2024, leaders of the Nation and St. Bonaventure community met for the first time to rekindle their relationship in a much more intentional way. Odie Porter, a Seneca Nation councilor, said the collaboration was about "polishing the chain of friendship," referring to a centuries-old metaphor about renewing relationships with Indigenous people.

The committee's specific focus will be to explore and develop strategies in the following areas:

- Enhancing Seneca and Haudenosaunee representation on campus through development of an appropriate Land Acknowledgement Statement as well as other actions and initiatives reflecting SBU's solidarity with and commitment to its Seneca neighbors.
- Developing educational collaborations, services and curricula related to Seneca and Indigenous communities.
- Establishing ways of growing together in friendship through events and gatherings and sharing news and advocacy of important issues and concerns.
- Fostering connections to Seneca SBU alumni and improving opportunities and a welcoming college experience for future Seneca students.

Land Acknowledgement

When the university and our neighbors in the Seneca Nation formed a committee to deepen their bonds of friendship, SBU's first commitment was to formally acknowledge the land upon which this university sits. At a pregame ceremony before a Bonnies basketball game on Feb. 9, 2025, the university unveiled the statement publicly for the first time (see video below).

With respect and contrition, we honor the Seneca Nation.

Praised be You, our Creator, through our native friends.

For generations, the Great Hill People and Keepers of the Western Door of the historic Haudenosaunee Confederacy have been the stewards of the land where St. Bonaventure University now resides.

As we journey together, may we polish our covenant chain of friendship, in humility, reconciliation, and peace.

School of Arts and Sciences

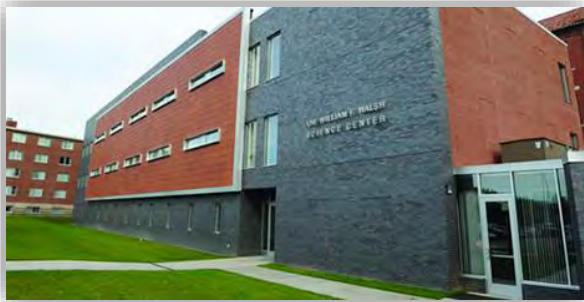
Arts & Sciences is an excellent source for professional training for any number of careers and for graduate school preparation.

Early Assurance Programs and Pathways

Early assurance programs and pathways enable interested high school seniors to secure a seat in one of St. Bonaventure's graduate-level programs as incoming freshmen. Transfer students and current SBU undergraduate students may seek early assurance to a graduate program as well.

Early assurance programs (EAP) offer students early acceptance to a graduate-level or professional program, granting them automatic placement in the program provided they maintain good standing in the undergraduate program and meet the graduate program's academic admission requirements.

Early Assurance in Cybersecurity	Our EAP in Cybersecurity secures placement for interested high school seniors and transfer students in our online master's degree program in Cybersecurity provided they maintain good standing in their undergraduate program and meet the graduate program's admission requirements.

Programs in Chemistry, Medicine, Dentistry, Pharmacy and PT

Chemistry majors at SBU are eligible for automatic acceptance and immediate entry to the Ph.D. program in chemistry at the University of Rhode Island.

Our Franciscan Health Care Professions Program offers opportunities for enrolled SBU students to apply for early acceptance to medical, dental or pharmacy school, or a physical therapy program. Many are combined-degree or dual-admit programs that grant talented high school seniors' provisional acceptance into the professional program upon entry to St. Bonaventure.

SBU-LECOM Dual Admit Program in Osteopathic Medicine	Qualified high school seniors accepted into this program have a reserved seat waiting for them at the Lake Erie College of Osteopathic Medicine (LECOM) upon graduation from SBU. Qualified current SBU students may apply up to Feb. 1 of their sophomore year.
SBU-NYIT College of Osteopathic Medicine Early Admission Program	Qualified St. Bonaventure students may declare their interest in applying for admission to the New York Institute of Technology College of Osteopathic Medicine after their sophomore year at SBU, then apply at the end of their junior year.
SBU-LECOM Dual Admit Program in Dentistry	Qualified high school seniors accepted into this program have a reserved seat waiting for them at the LECOM School of Dental Medicine upon graduation from SBU. Qualified current SBU students may be eligible to apply and will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
SBU-University at Buffalo Dual Admit Program in Pharmacy & Pharmaceutical Sciences	Qualified students accepted into this competitive program have a conditional seat waiting for them at the UB School of Pharmaceutical Sciences after attending SBU for three years. The program is completed with an additional four years at the UB, leading to both a BS and a PharmD degree.

SBU-Daemen Dual Admit Program in Physical Therapy	Qualified high school seniors accepted into this program are dually admitted to St. Bonaventure University and Daemen University's Department of Physical Therapy. Current SBU students may qualify to enter this program and will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
SBU-St. Francis U. Combined Degree in Physical Therapy	Qualified high school seniors accepted into this program have a provisional seat waiting for them at St. Francis (Pa.) University Department of Physical Therapy after attending SBU. Current SBU students may also qualify for this program and will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

Early Acceptance Ph.D. Programs

Students who graduate with a Bachelor of Science degree in Chemistry from St. Bonaventure University are eligible for automatic acceptance to Ph.D. programs in chemistry at the University at Buffalo and the University of Rhode Island.

University at Buffalo

An articulation agreement between SBU and UB grants students who earn a B.S. in Chemistry from St. Bonaventure automatic acceptance in the Ph.D. in Chemistry program at the University at Buffalo provided they have an overall GPA of 3.5, and a letter of support from the SBU Chemistry Department chair.

Upon application to UB, when it is determined that a student has met the special admission criteria, an immediate letter of acceptance will be issued.

Students in UB's Ph.D. in Chemistry program receive free tuition, health and other benefits, and a stipend of approximately \$26,000, with potential to garner additional stipends based on academic performance.

A maximum of three students a year will be accepted by UB through this agreement. Students who do not meet the program's criteria may still be considered by UB on a standard case-by-case basis.

University of Rhode Island

An articulation agreement between SBU and URI grants students who earn a B.S. in Chemistry from St. Bonaventure automatic entry into Rhode Island's doctoral program in Chemistry provided they have earned an overall grade-point average of 3.2 or higher at St. Bonaventure and have a letter of support from the chair of SBU's Chemistry department.

St. Bonaventure students apply for the program through the URI application portal in the winter of their senior year. If they meet the special admission criteria they are automatically accepted and immediately welcomed into the University of Rhode Island Department of Chemistry Ph.D. degree program upon graduation from SBU.

The URI program typically runs from four to six years, depending on a student's research and contribution to science. Students in URI's Ph.D. program may qualify for sizable stipends, health insurance and waivers for tuition.

Up to five St. Bonaventure students a year will be accepted through this agreement.

The RN to B.S. in Nursing and Dual Degree in Nursing, and the Master's Entry to Practice programs at St. Bonaventure University is accredited by the **Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education** (<http://www.ccneaccreditation.org>).

Officially recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education as a national accreditation agency, the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE) is an autonomous accrediting agency, contributing to the improvement of the public's health. CCNE ensures the quality and integrity of baccalaureate, graduate, and residency programs in nursing.



The entry-level occupational therapy master's degree program is accredited by the **Accreditation Council for Occupational Therapy Education (ACOTE)** of the American Occupational Therapy Association (AOTA), located at 6116 Executive Boulevard, Suite 200, North Bethesda, MD 20852-4929. ACOTE's telephone number c/o AOTA is (301) 652-AOTA and its web address is www.acoteonline.org. Graduates of the program will be eligible to sit for the national certification examination for the occupational therapist administered by the National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy (NBCOT). After successful completion of this exam, the individual will be an occupational therapist, registered (OTR). In addition, all states require licensure in order to practice; however, state licenses are usually based on the results of the NBCOT Certification Examination. Note that a felony conviction may affect a graduate's ability to sit for the NBCOT certification examination or attain state licensure.



The Accreditation Review Commission on Education for the Physician Assistant, Inc. (ARC-PA) has granted Accreditation-Continued status to the St. Bonaventure University Physician Assistant Program sponsored by St. Bonaventure University. Accreditation-Continued is an accreditation status granted when a currently accredited program is in compliance with the ARC-PA Standards.

Accreditation remains in effect until the program closes or withdraws from the accreditation process or until accreditation is withdrawn for failure to comply with the Standards. The approximate date for the next validation review of the program by the ARC-PA will be July 2035. The review date is contingent upon continued compliance with the Accreditation Standards and ARC-PA policy.

Percentages of Enrolled Minorities/Female 2012-2025



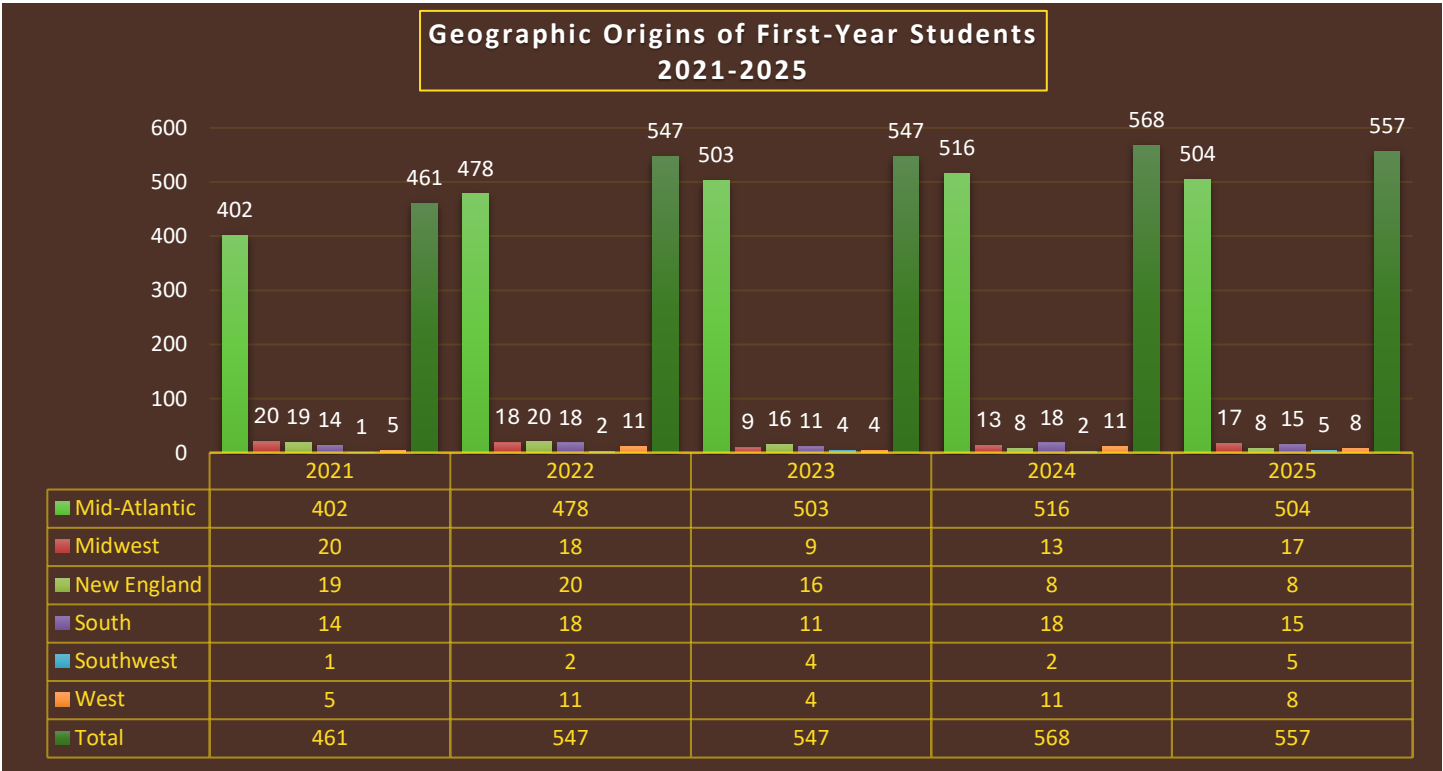

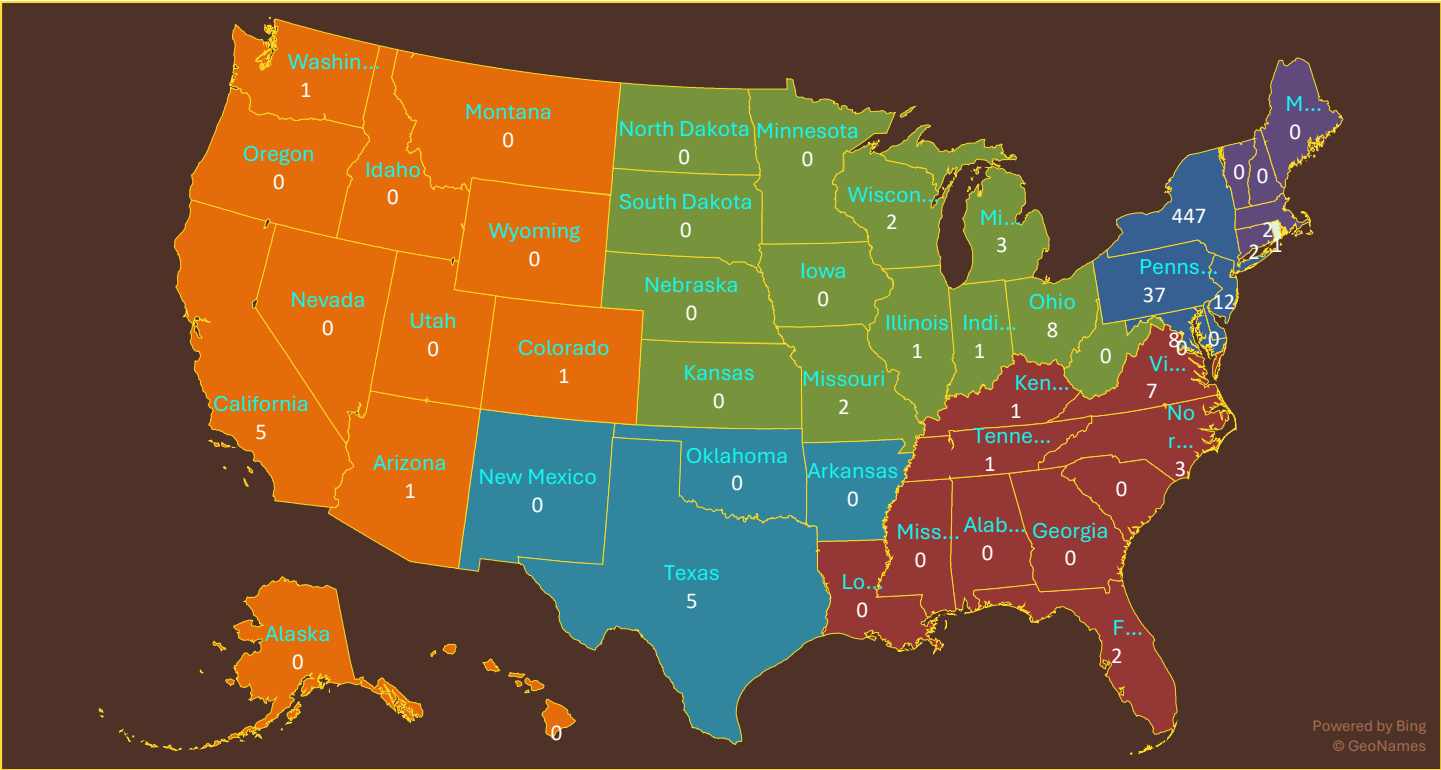

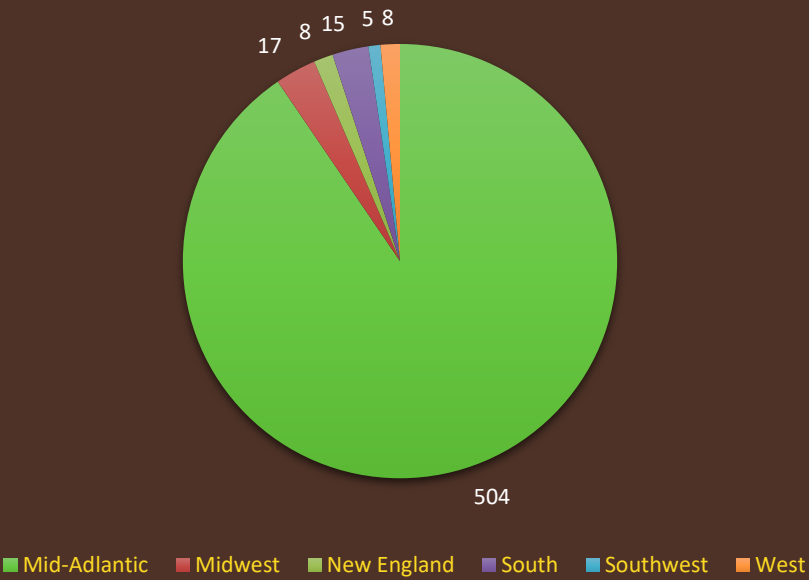

Geographic Origins of First-Year Students (Fall 2025), by U.S. Region

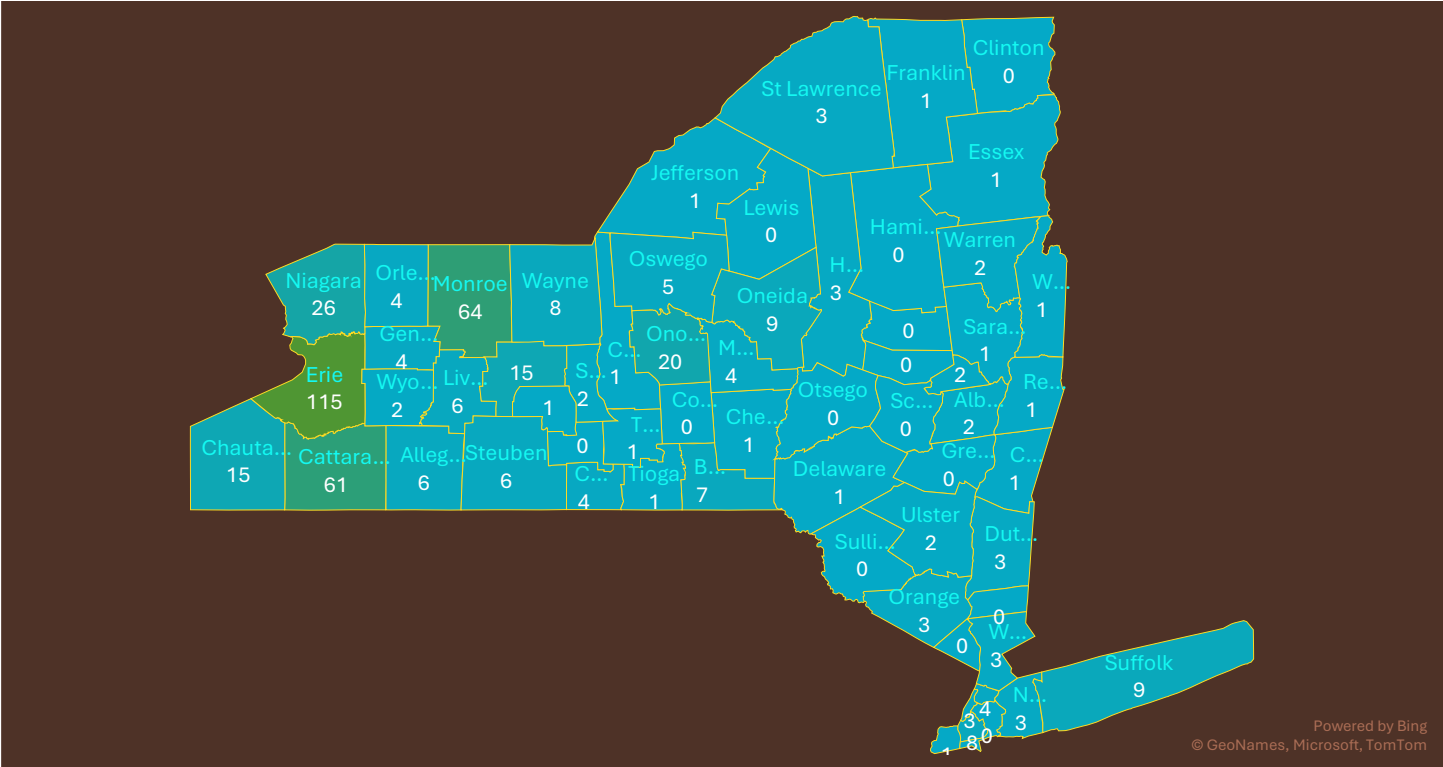

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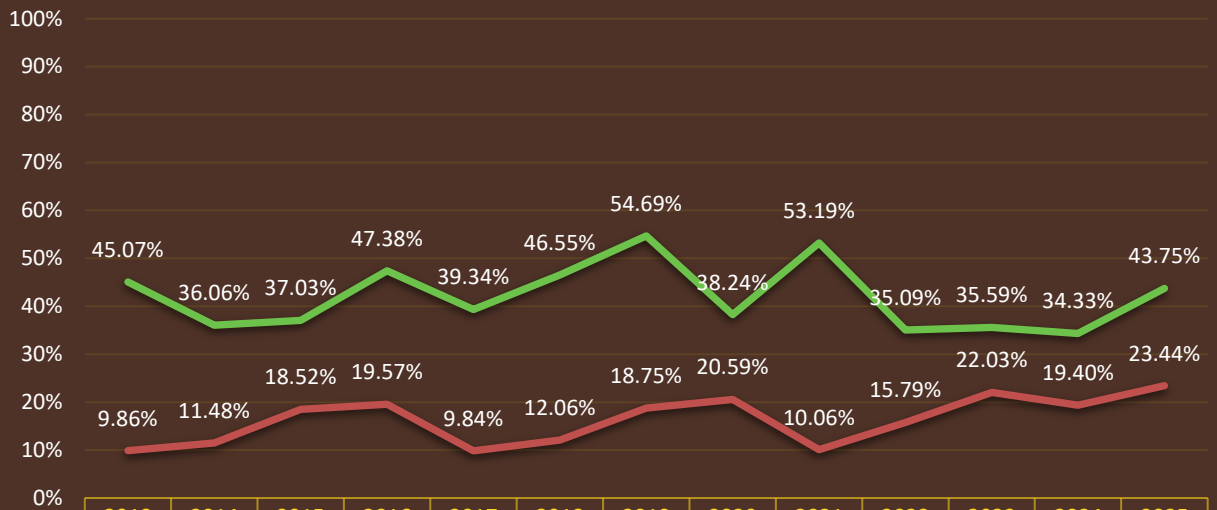

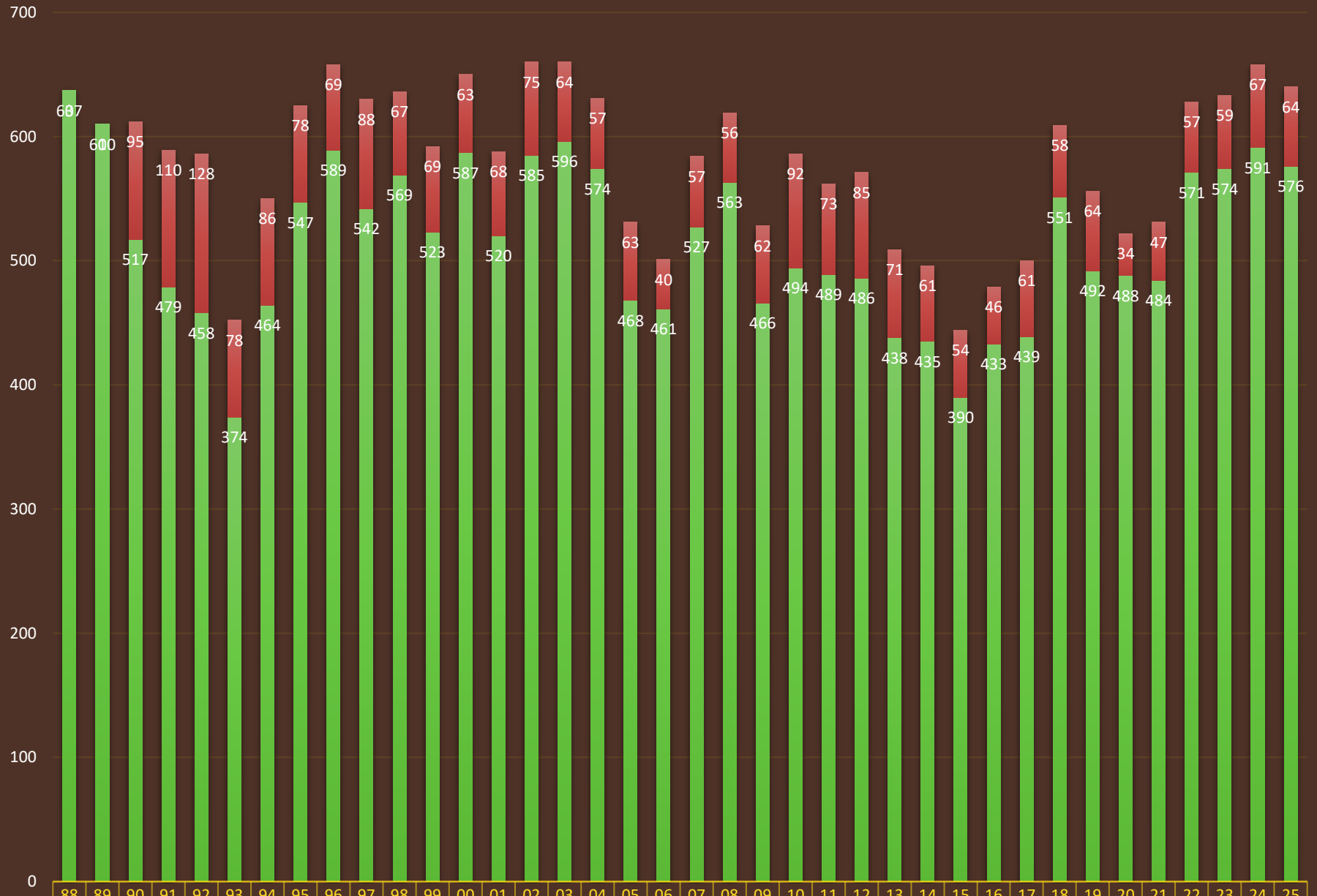

Freshman and Transfer - Fall Cohorts 1988-2025



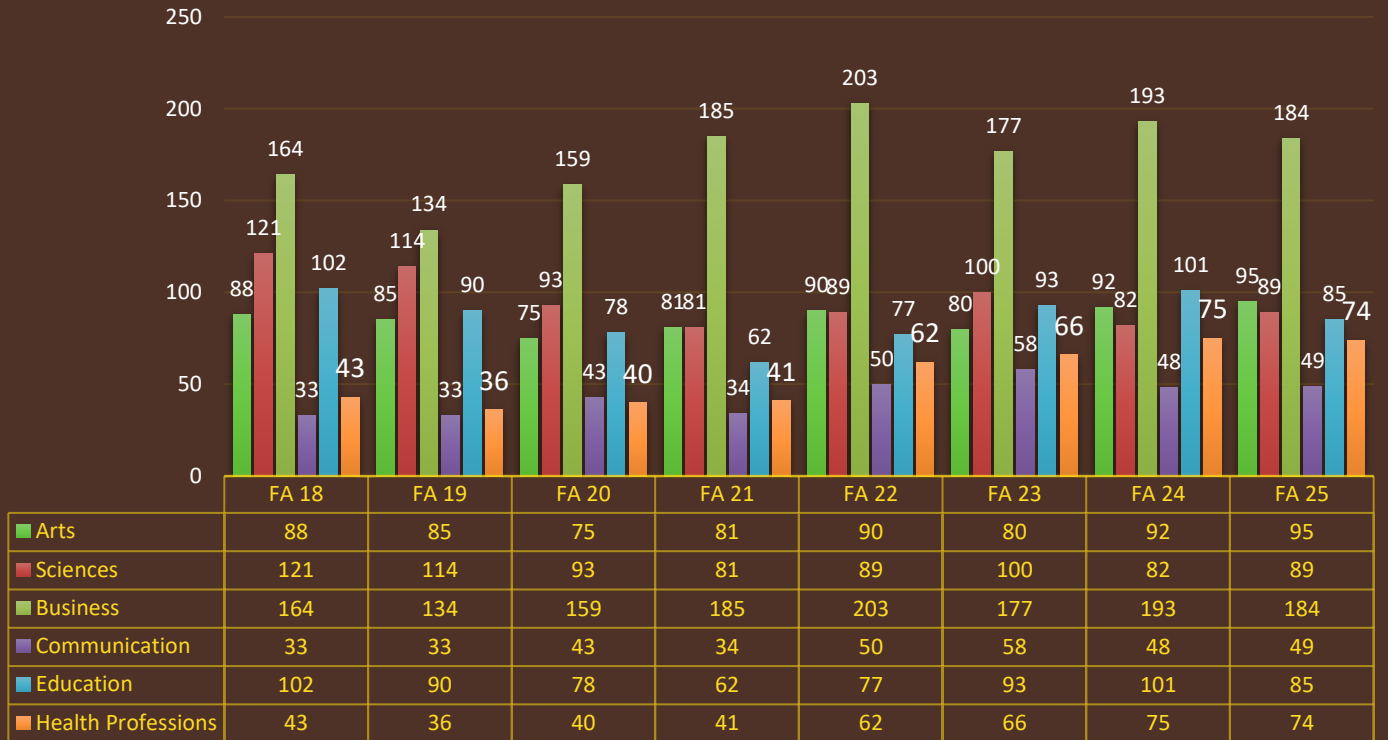

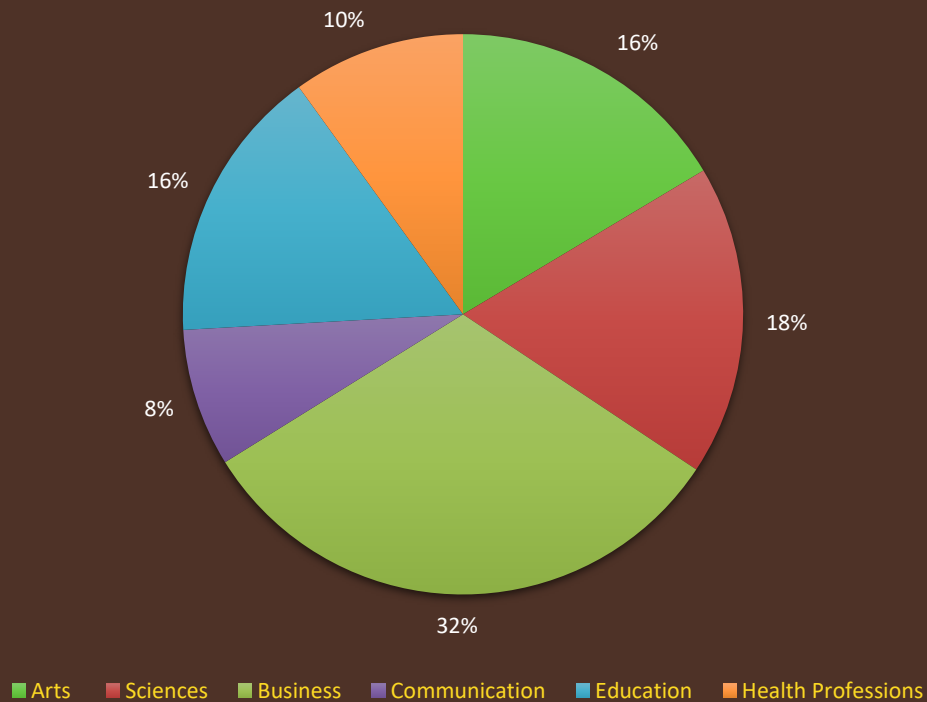

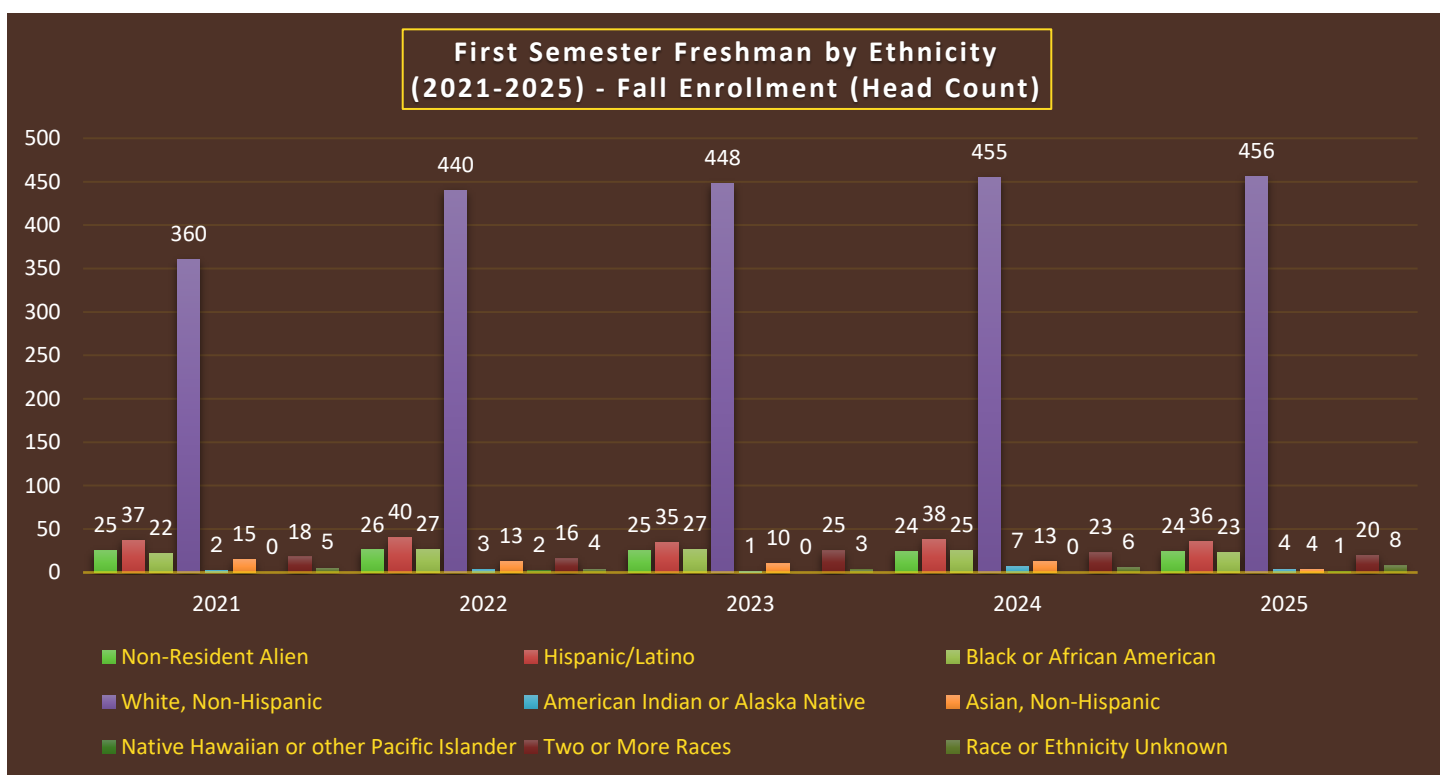
**First-Semester Freshman Enrollment by School (Headcount)

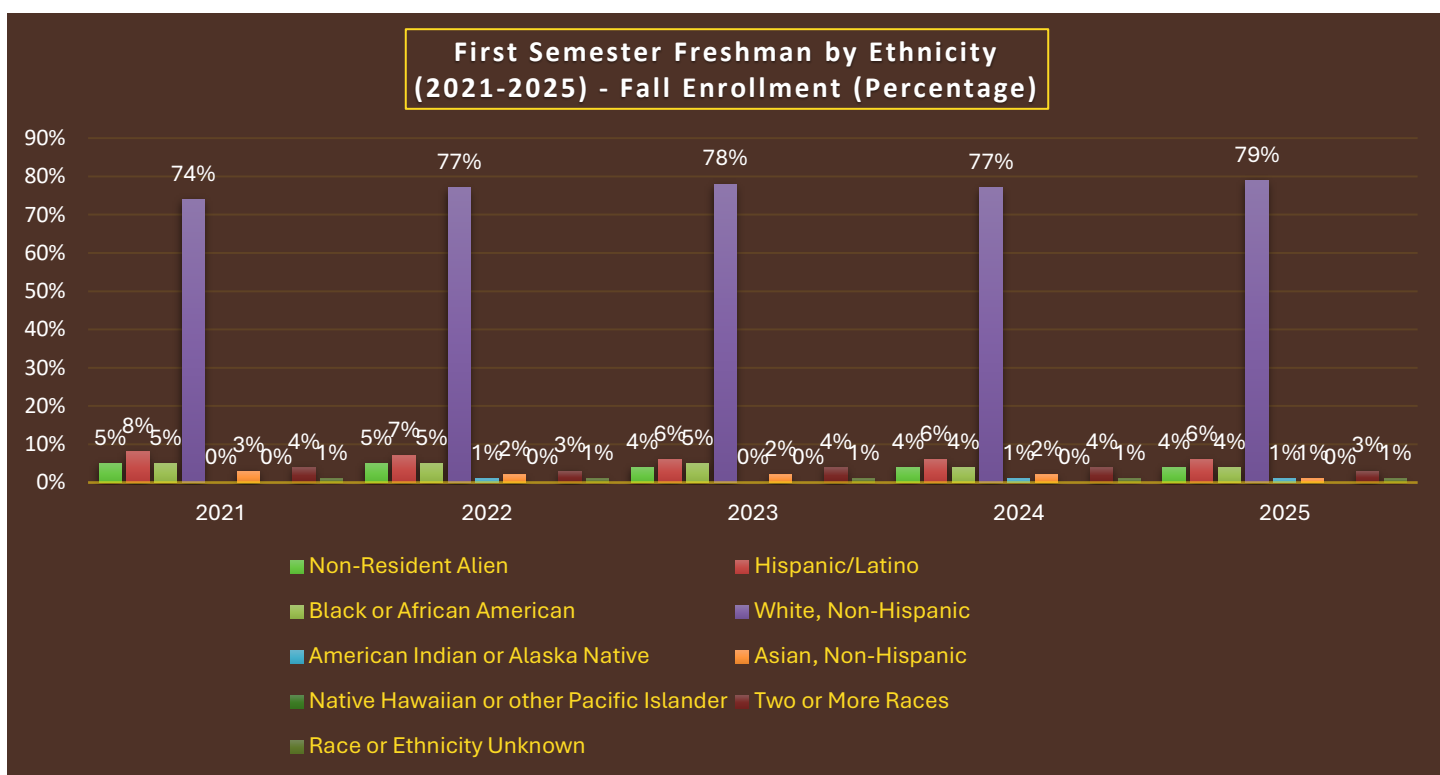
**First-Semester Freshman Enrollment by School (Percentage)

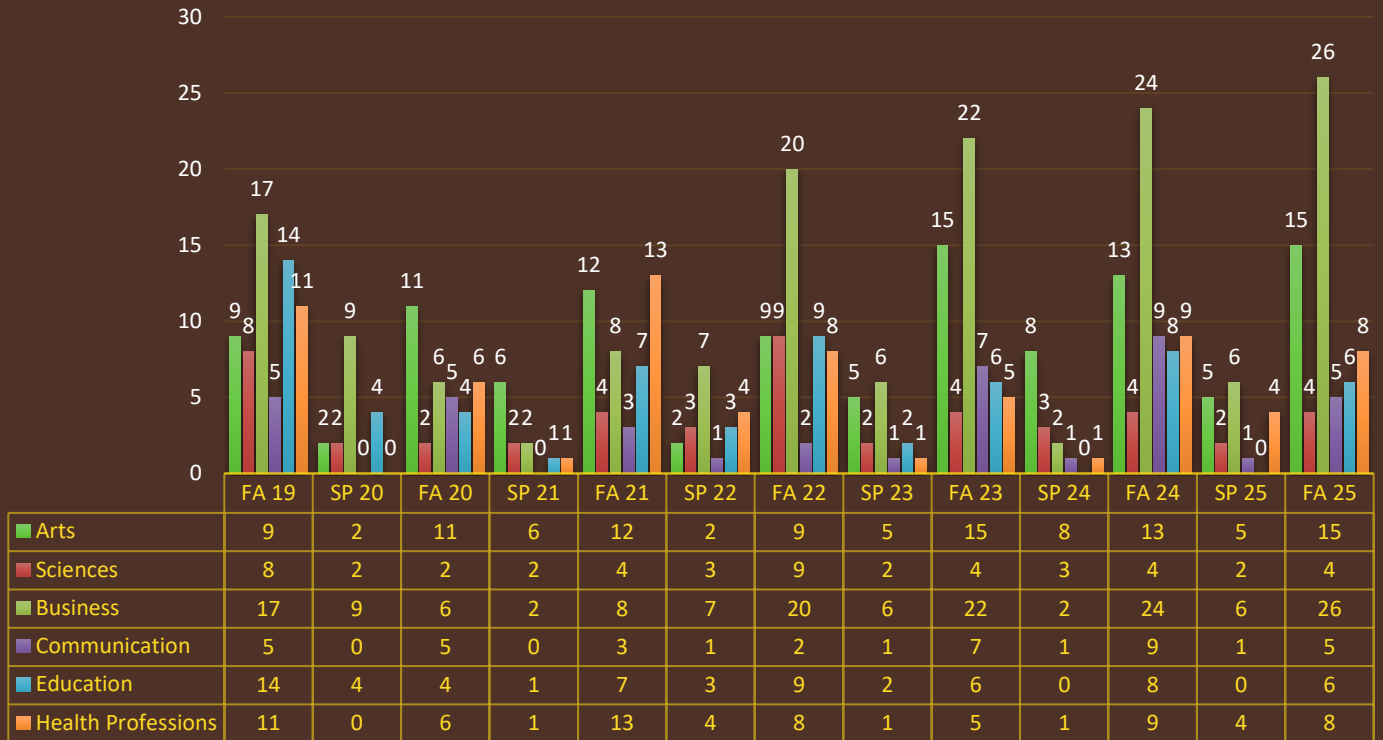

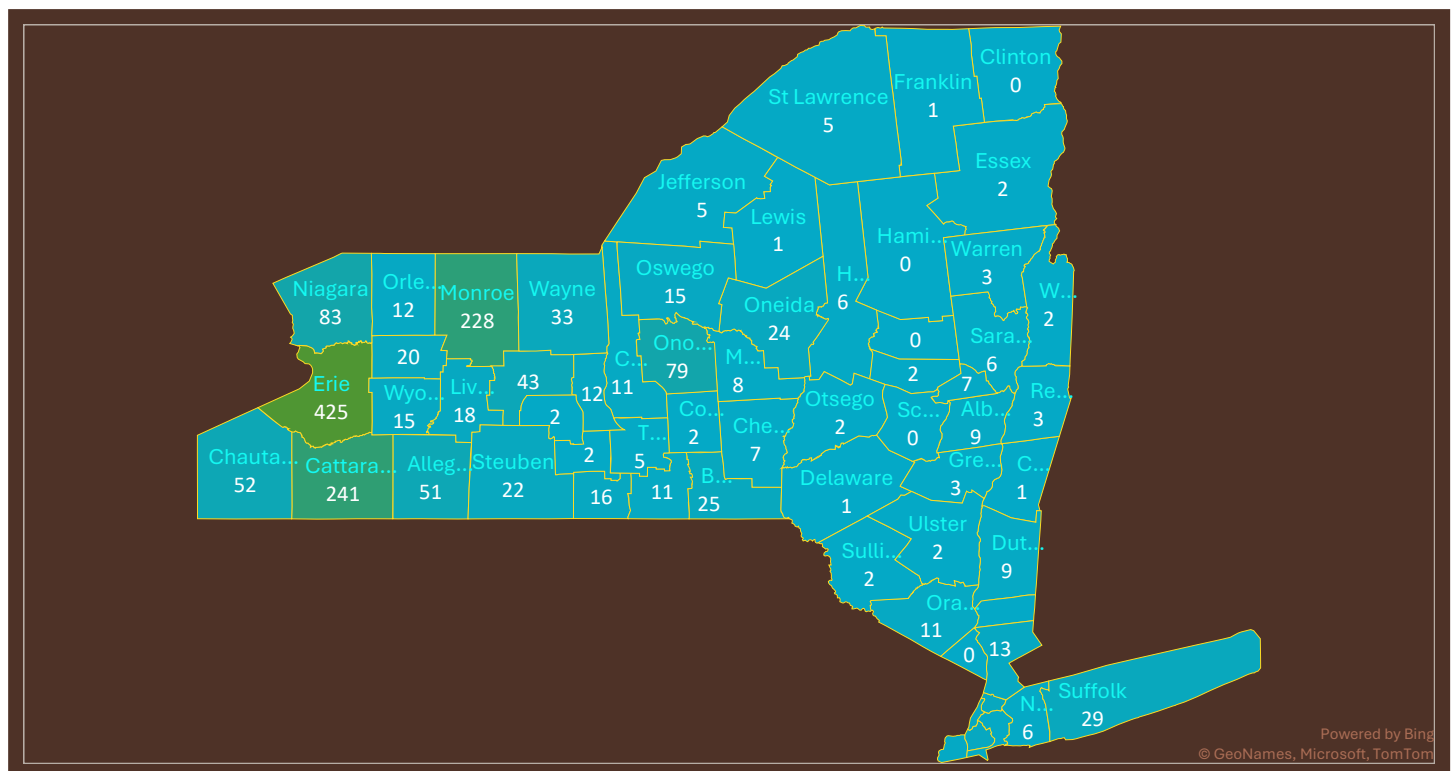
Geographic Origins of Enrolled Undergraduate Students (Fall 2025), by U.S. Region & State



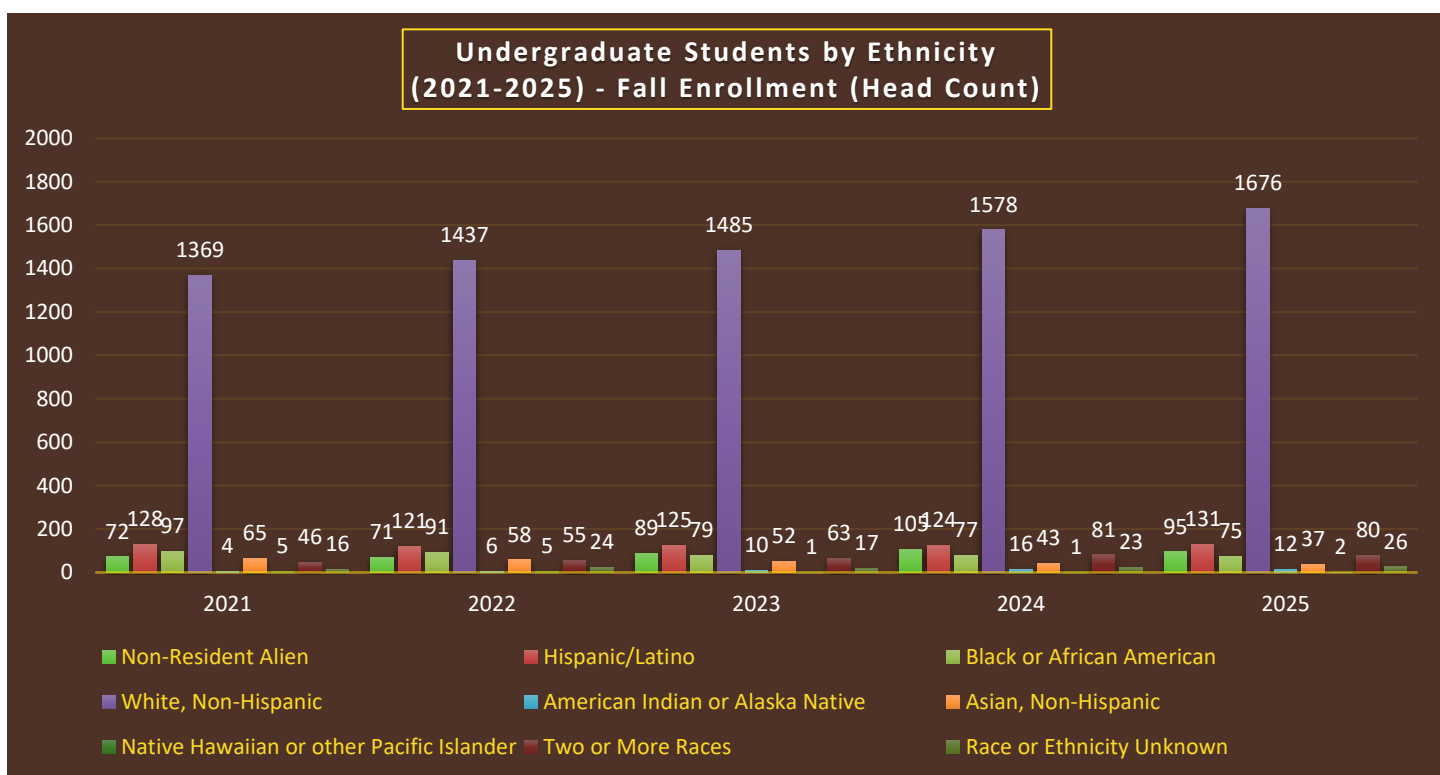

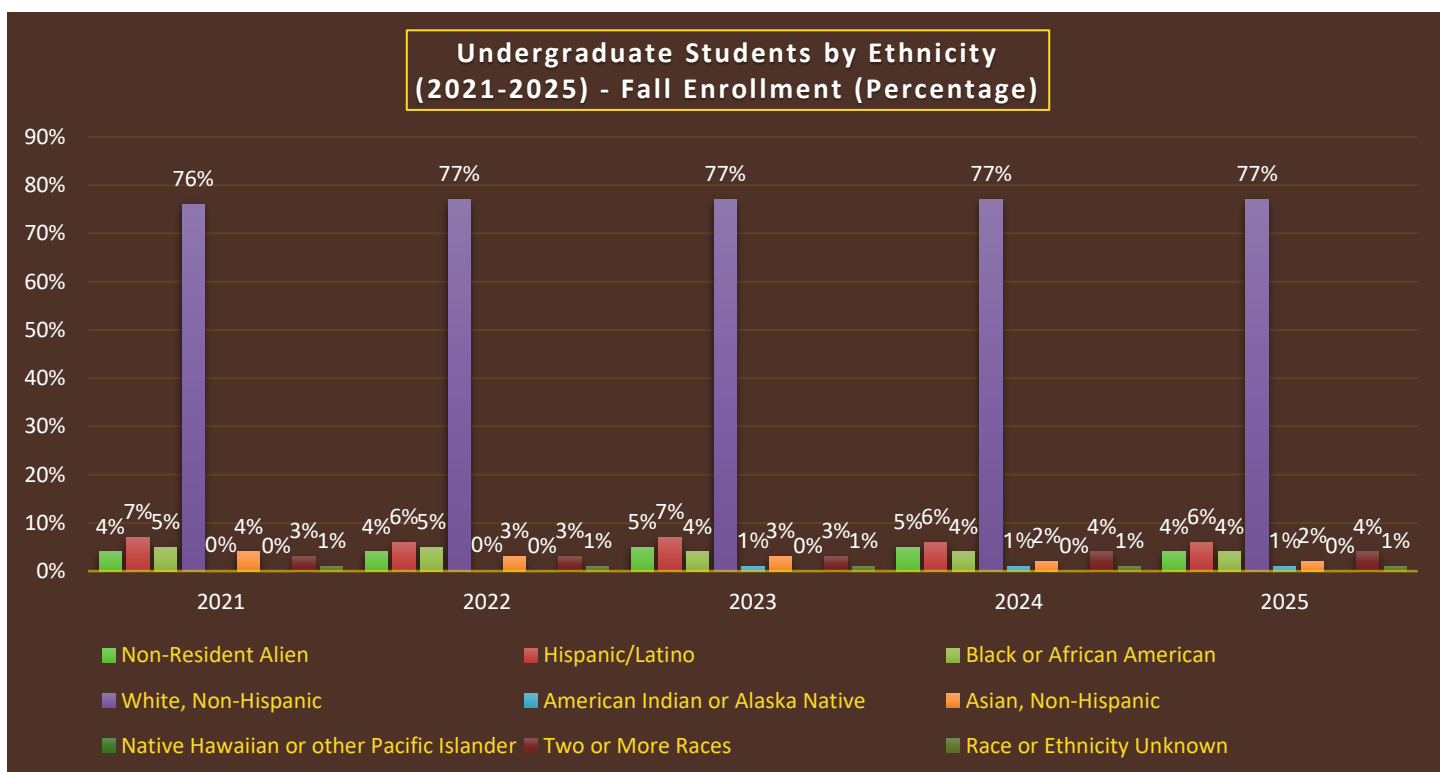
Geographic Origins of Enrolled Undergraduate Students (Fall 2025), by New York State County

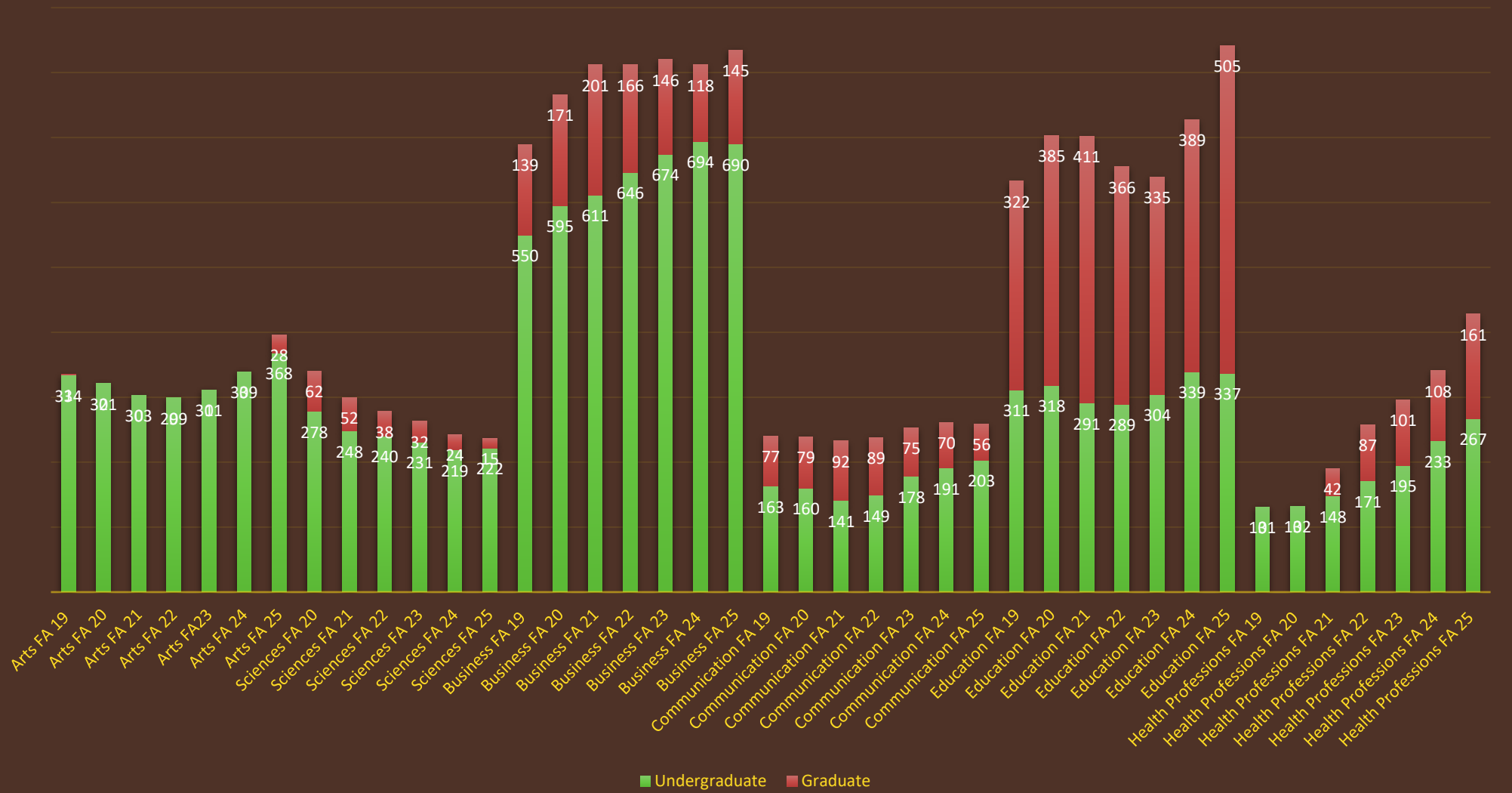

Headcount Enrollment by Division - Fall Semesters 2019-2025

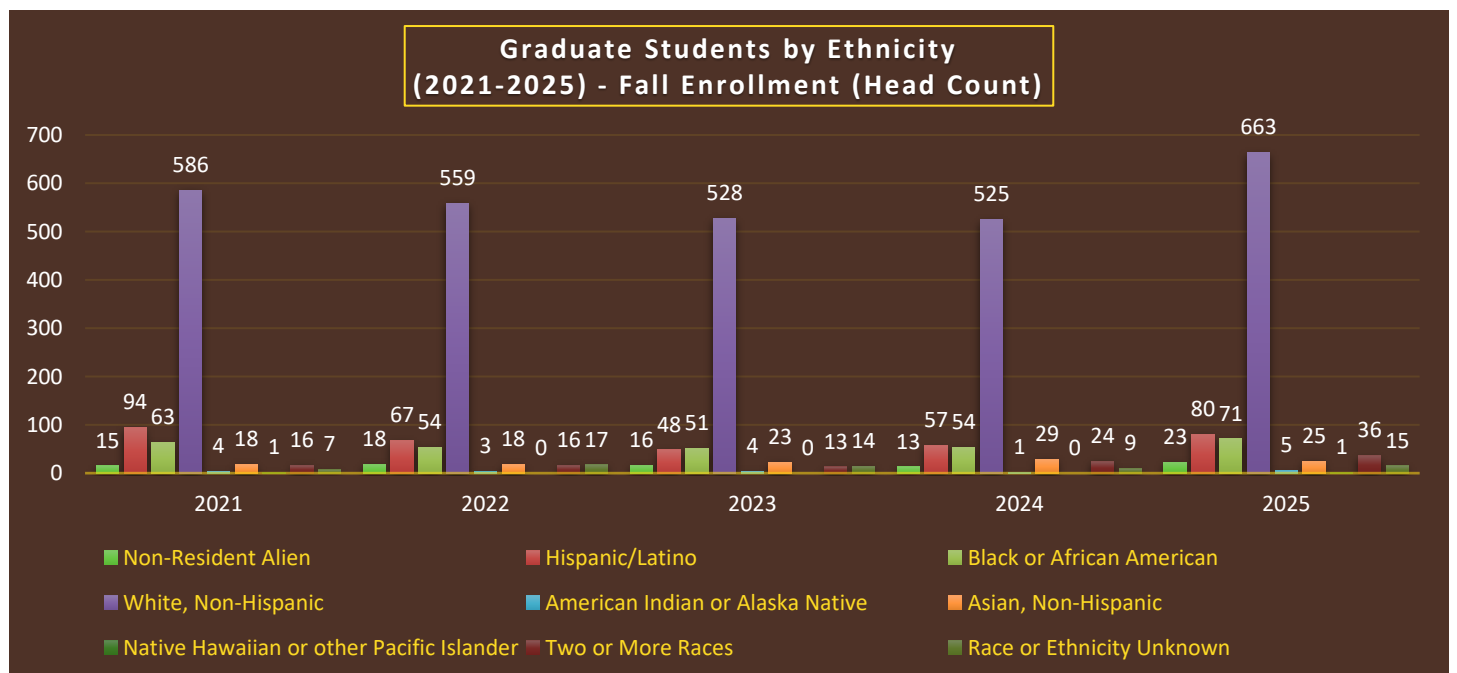

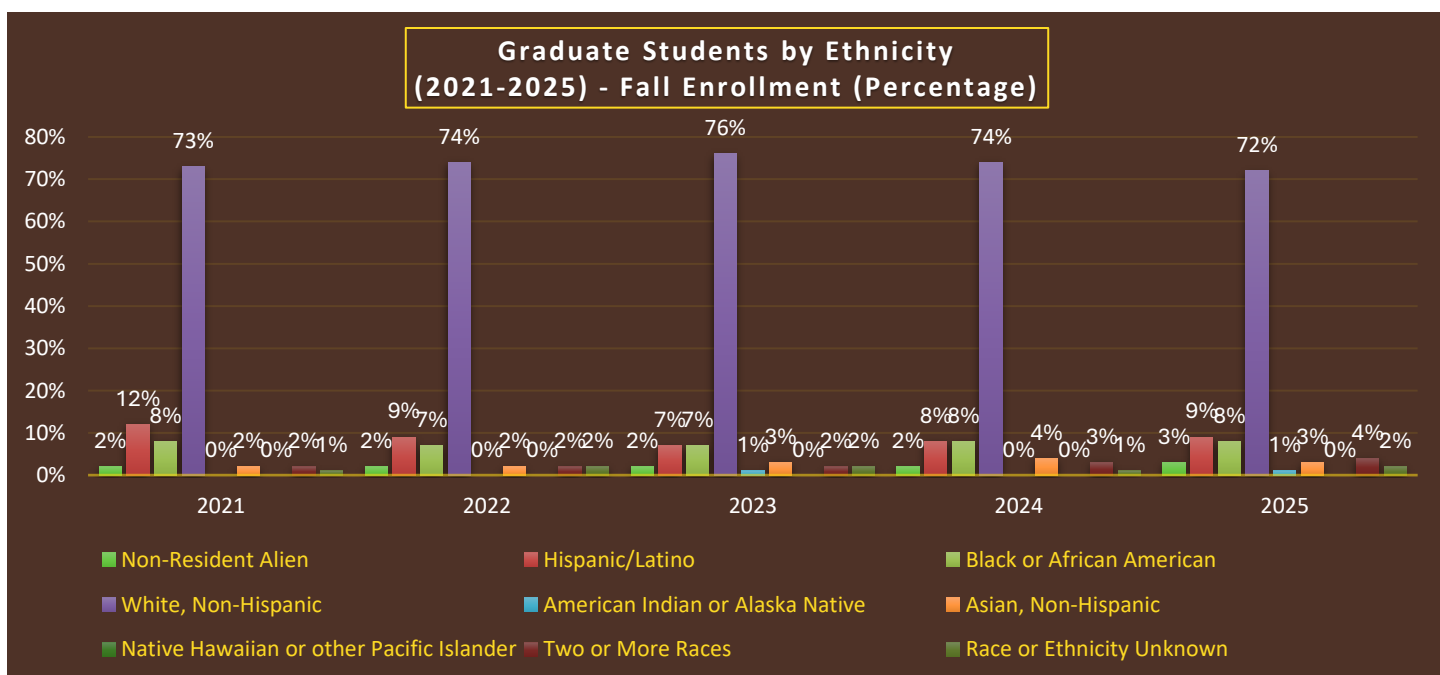

Graduate Enrollment by Program & Location - Headcount (2020 - 2025) - (September 15, 2025)

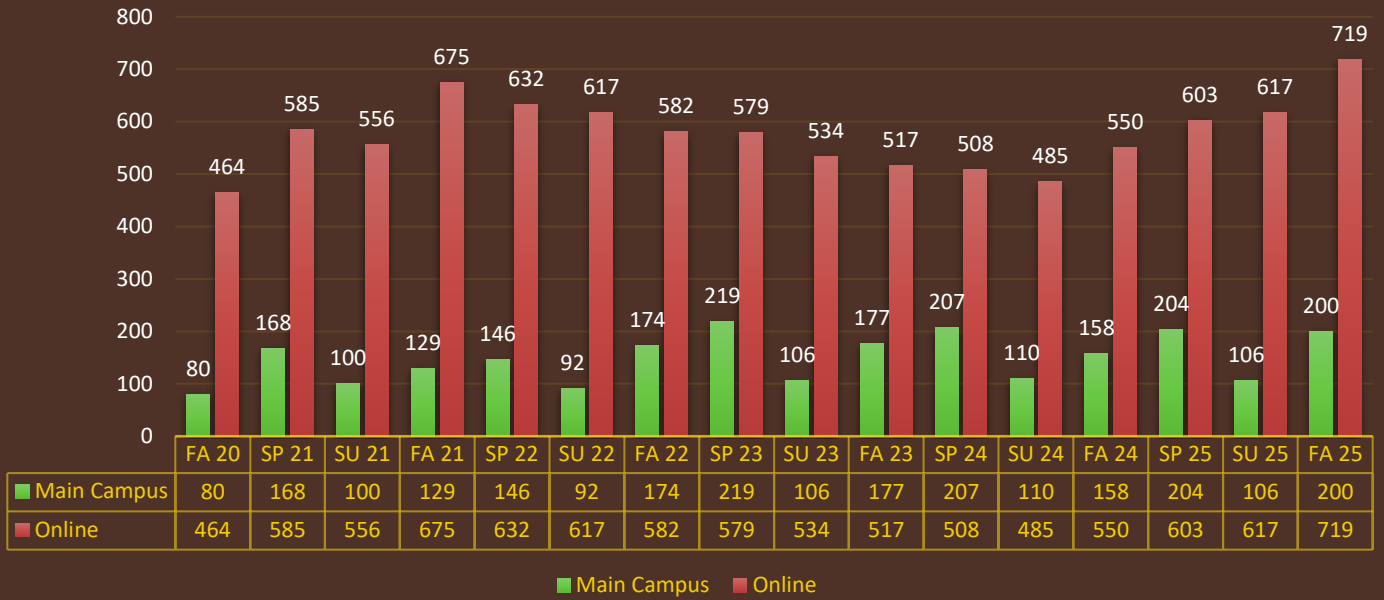

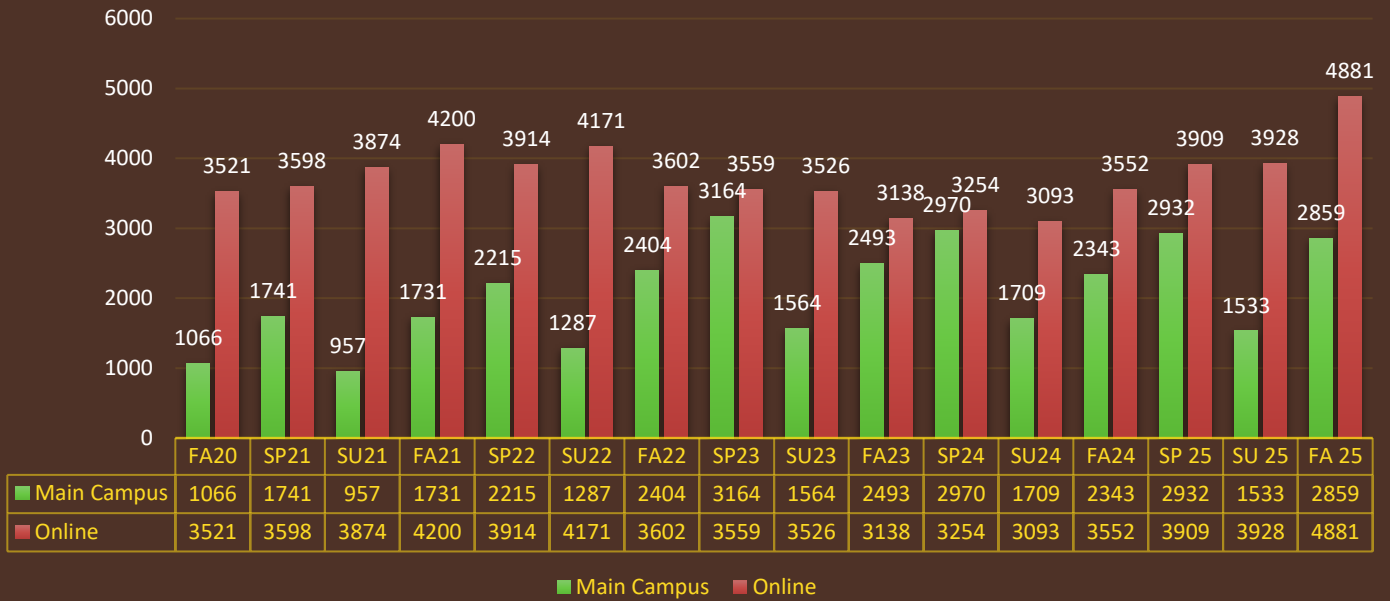

Graduate Enrollment by Location Student Credit Hours - All Semesters 2020-2025



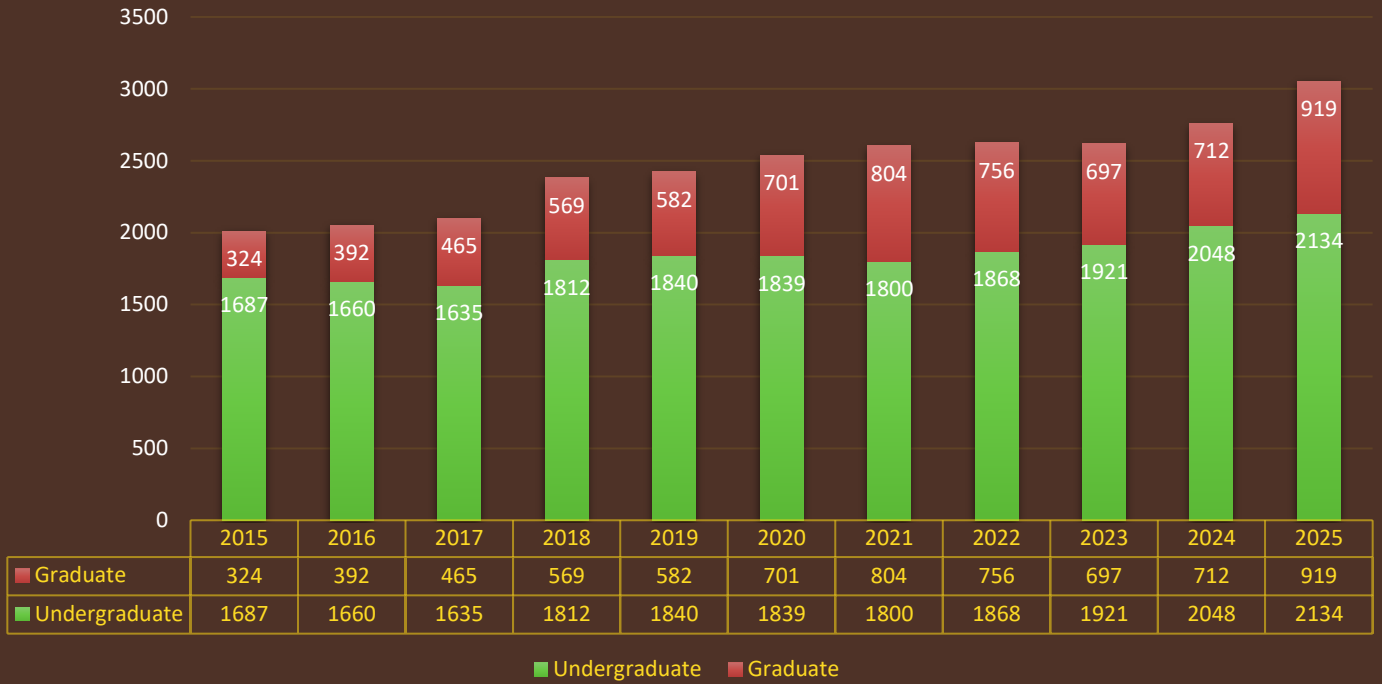

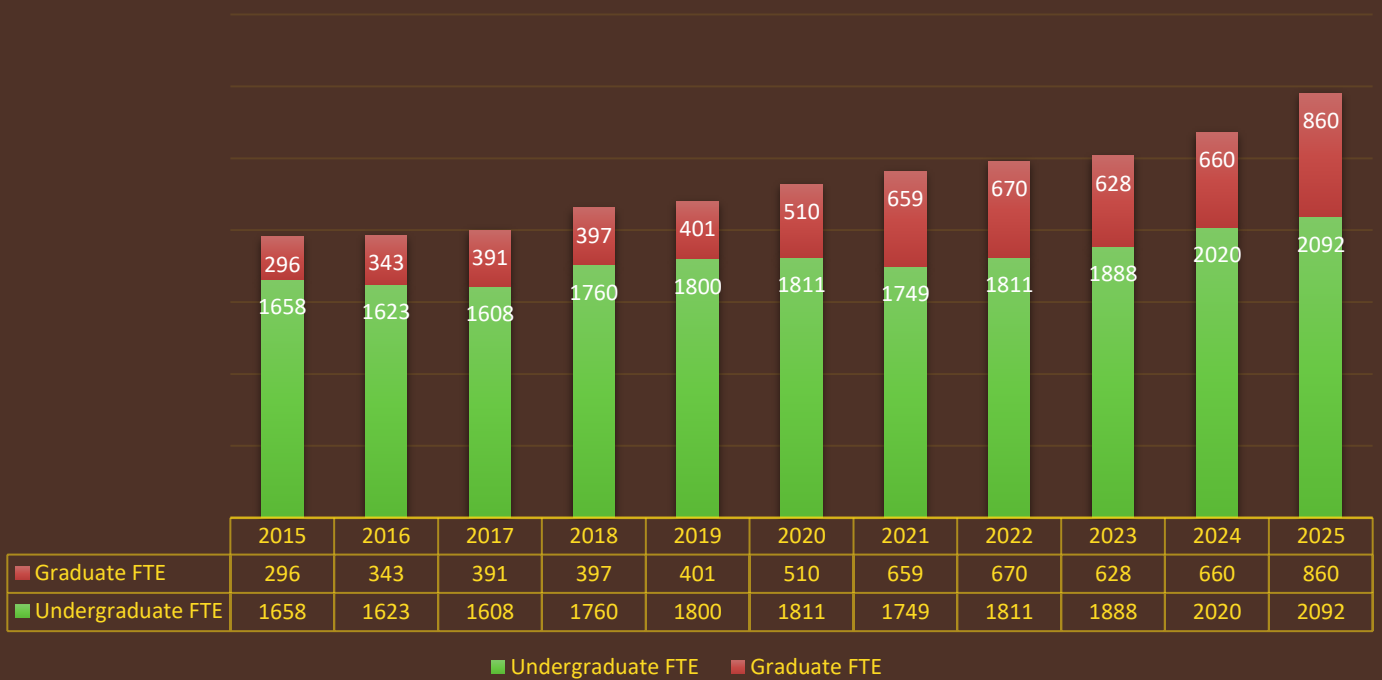

Undergraduate & Graduate Enrollment - Headcount 2015-2025



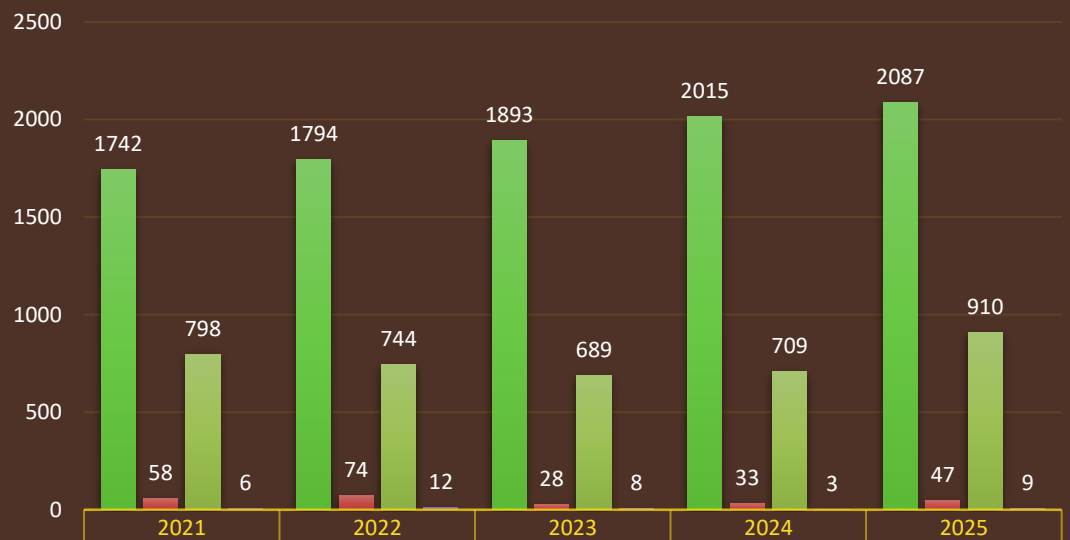
Undergraduate & Graduate Enrollment - FTE 2015-2025

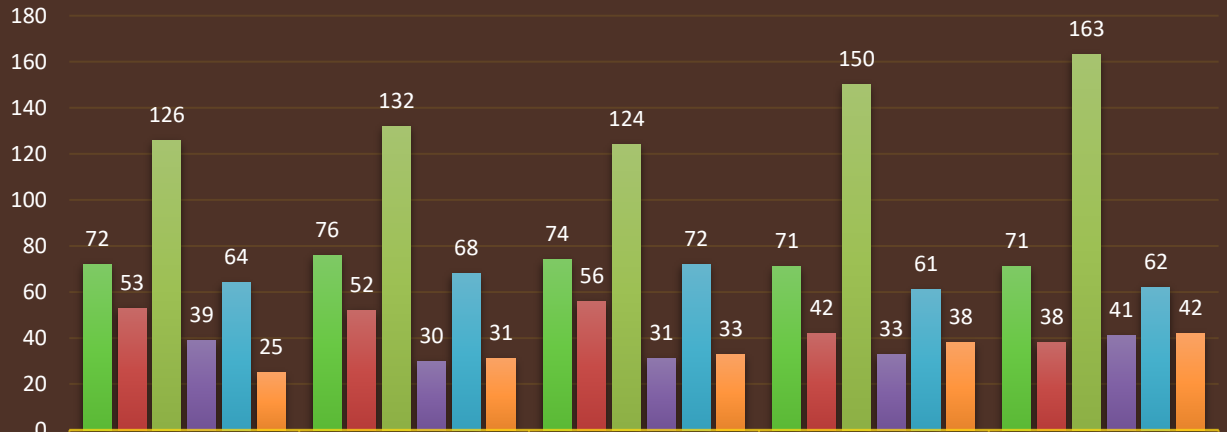

Undergraduate Degrees Conferred by Field of Studies 2020-2025



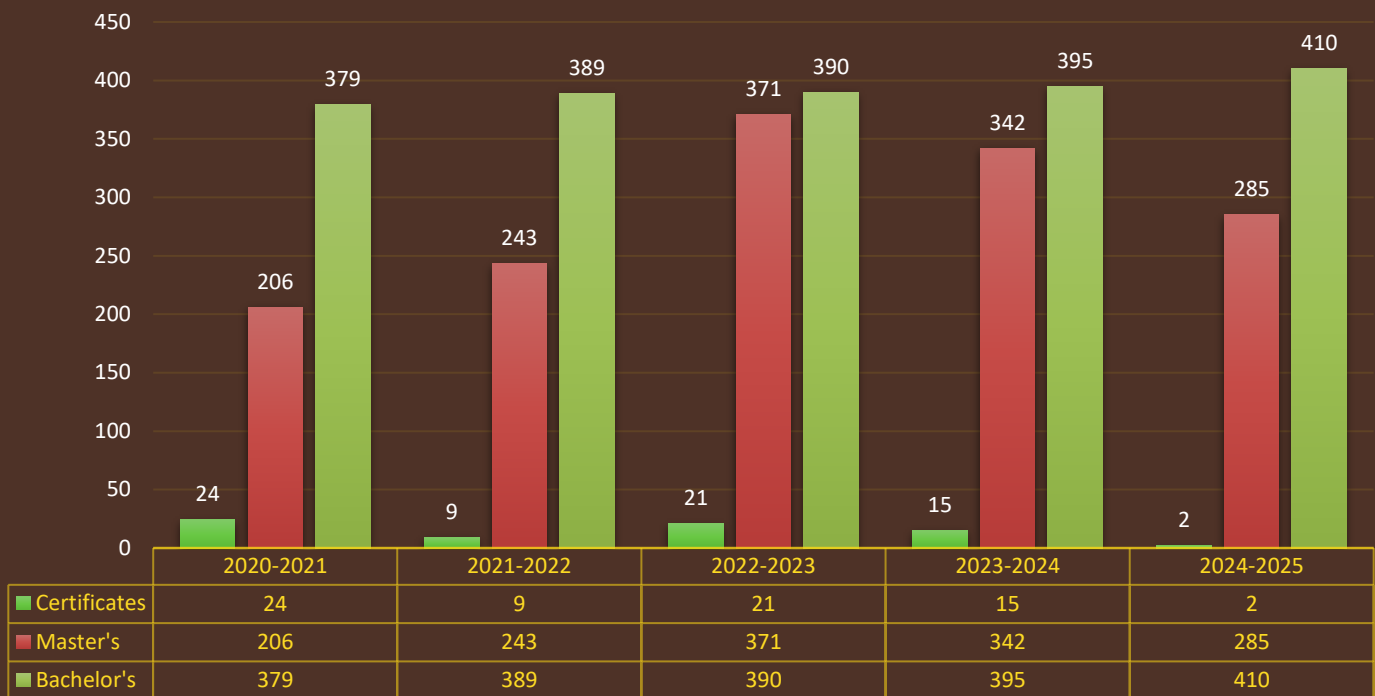

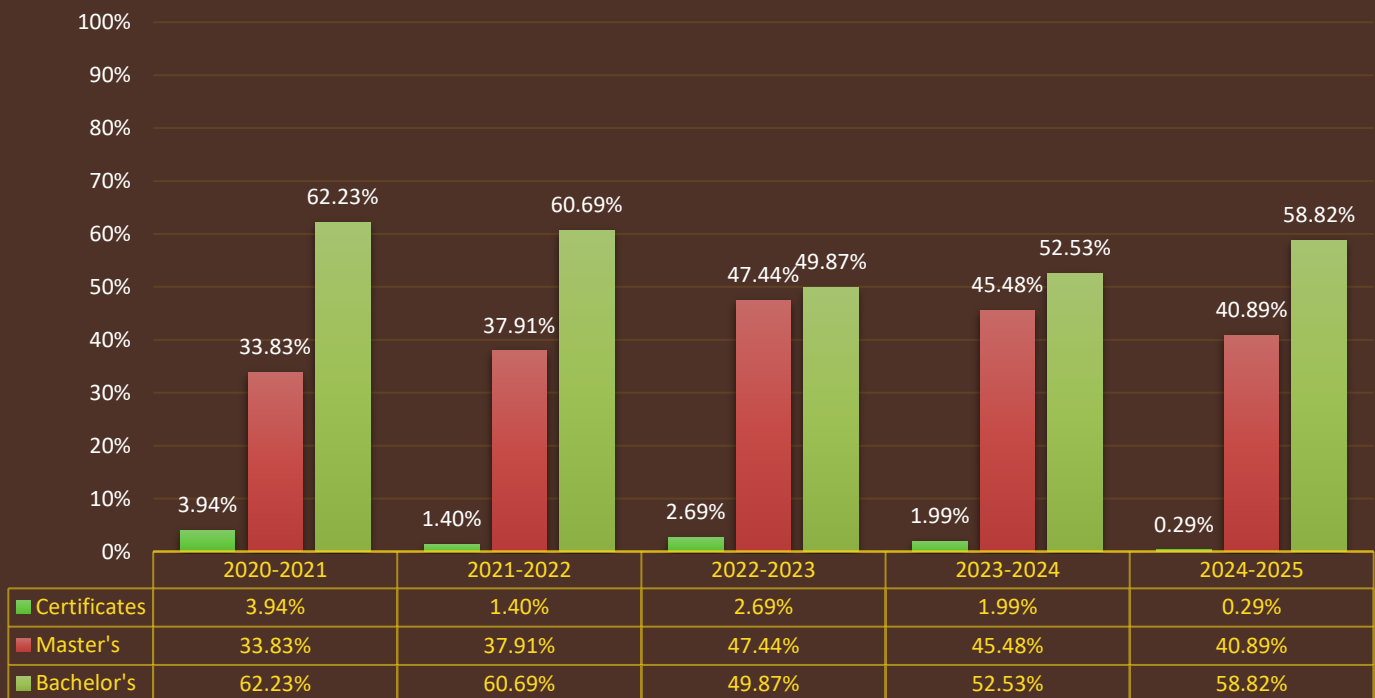

2020-2025**



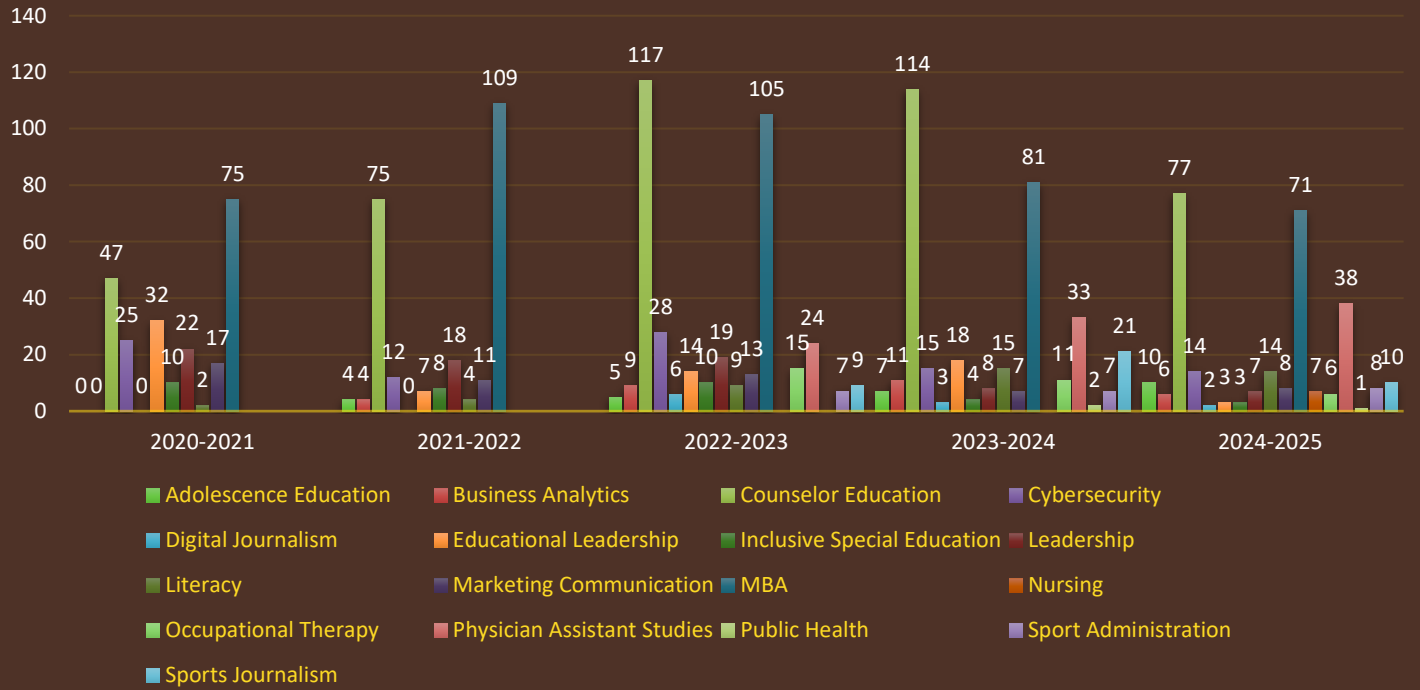

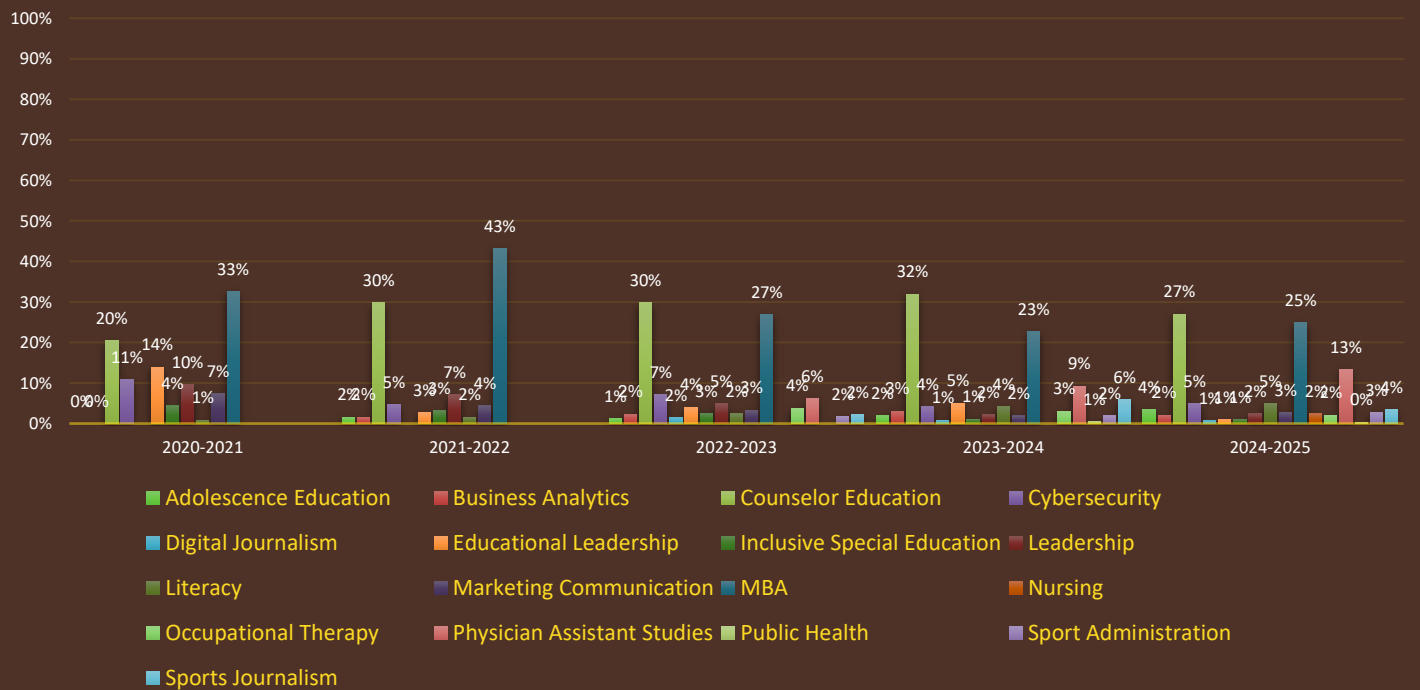

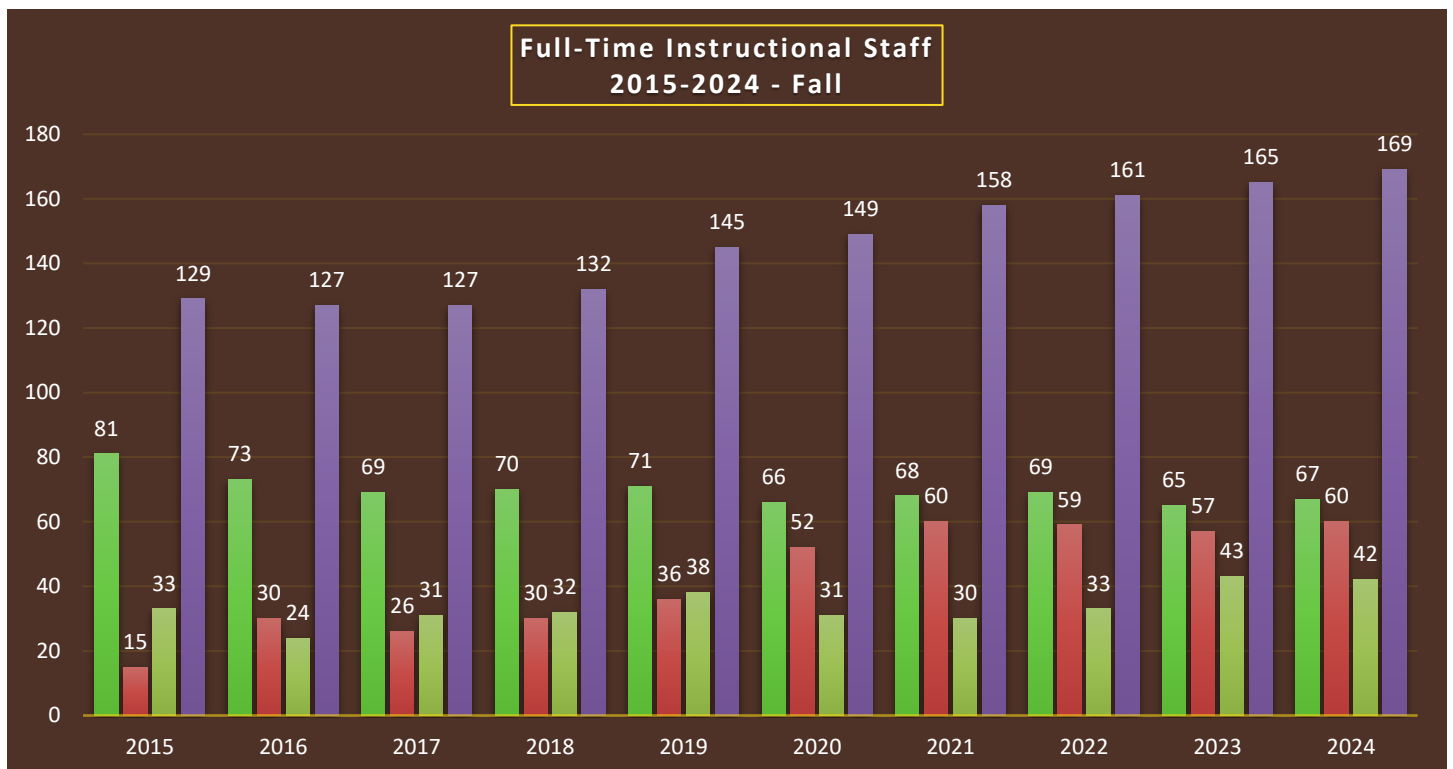
