The successful candidate will direct the University's Concert Choir and Chamber Singers, and provide applied Vocal studio instruction to students of all voice types and levels. On occasion, the successful candidate will also teach courses in Music Appreciation (as part of the University's core curriculum) or survey courses in any area of Music History. The teaching load is twelve credit hours per semester.

Candidates must have a Master's degree in music or music education, previous college-level teaching experience, and appropriate piano skills. The ability to provide vocal or instrumental instruction in jazz and/or music theater is desirable.
