

# For Parenting & Pregnant Students

## St. Bonaventure University

"Title IX of the Education amendments of 1972 ("Title ix"), 20 u.s.c. 1681 et seq., is a federal civil rights law that prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex - including pregnancy and parental status - in educational programs and activities."

### YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

- be provided with reasonable accommodations, such as a larger desk, elevator access, or allowance for frequent bathroom breaks, when necessary, because of your pregnancy.
- make up any work missed while on medical leave.
- not be required to submit a doctor's note for absences related to your pregnancy or childbirth, unless ALL students are required to submit a doctor's note for absences and hospitalizations related to a physical or emotional condition requiring treatment by a doctor.
- continue participating in classes and extracurricular activities while you are pregnant.
- not be penalized for absences due to pregnancy or childbirth for as long as your doctor deems necessary.
- submit work after a deadline you missed because of pregnancy or childbirth.
- make up any participation or attendance credits you did not have the chance to earn due to your pregnancy-related absence.
- be provided with the same special services as students with temporary medical conditions.

### LACTATION ROOMS

As part of the University's dedication to supporting working and learning parents, private lactation rooms have been made available to accommodate nursing mothers.
